1. Complete an online Part-Time application:

2. Choose a program.

When completing your application, please select the Faculty of Social Science. If you wish to change your Faculty, you can do so after you have completed your first course.

3. Have all schools you have previously attended (high school, colleges and universities) send your transcripts directly to the Admissions Office.

If you have been out of high school for more than five years, high school transcripts will not be required.
